1. Traditional Whole Life (Non-Participating)

- Fixed premiums, fixed death benefit
- Guaranteed cash value growth (5-6%)
- No dividends
- Simple, predictable
- **Best for:** Conservative planners wanting guarantees

2. Participating Whole Life (With-Profits)

- Fixed premiums, death benefit can grow
- Guaranteed cash value growth (5-6%) + potential dividends (1-3%)
- Share in insurer's profits
- Higher potential returns (7-9% total)
- **Best for:** Those wanting upside potential with guarantees

3. Limited-Pay Whole Life

- Pay premiums for limited period (10-20 years), coverage lifetime
- Higher annual premiums but finish paying early

- **Best for:** High earners wanting to "pre-pay" coverage

4. Single Premium Whole Life

The Solution (Cross-Purchase Agreement):

- Susan has Ksh 20M whole life (beneficiary: James)
- James has Ksh 20M whole life (beneficiary: Susan's estate)
- If Susan dies: James receives Ksh 20M, buys Susan's shares from family
- Business continues, family gets fair value immediately

Additional Benefit: After 15 years (Susan age 57):

- Cash value: Ksh 6,500,000
- Susan borrowed Ksh 5M from cash value
- Used to expand business (bought 3 new trucks)
- Business value increased Ksh 12M from expansion
- Repaying loan from business profits

Tax Benefit Over 15 Years: $\text{Ksh } 46,500 \times 15 = \text{Ksh } 697,500$ total relief

Outcome:

- Business protected from partner death
- Cash value used to grow business
- Family secured regardless of Susan's death timing
- Tax relief reduced effective cost significantly

ESTATE PLANNING INTEGRATION

Why Whole Life is Essential for Estate Planning

Problem 1: Illiquid Estates

Most wealthy Kenyans' estates are:

- Land (can't divide easily, takes months/years to sell)
- Businesses (forced sale destroys value)
- Properties (rental income stops, selling takes time)

Solution:

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

Q: Why is whole life so much more expensive than term?

A: You're paying for lifetime coverage (not just 20 years) PLUS building cash value. It's insurance + forced savings combined. However, tax relief reduces your effective cost by 15%.

Q: Can I convert term life to whole life later?

A: Yes, most term policies have conversion options (no medical exam). But converting at age 60 is expensive. Better to start whole life younger if you know you want it.

Q: What if I can't afford premiums later?

A: Options: (1) Use cash value to pay premiums, (2) Reduce death benefit/lower premiums, (3) Surrender policy and receive cash value.

Q: How is cash value taxed?

A: Cash value growth is tax-deferred while in policy. Policy loans are tax-free. Death benefit is tax-free. Surrenders may be partially taxable (gains above premiums paid).

Q: Should I buy whole life instead of investing separately?

A: Depends. Aggressive investors getting 15%+ returns elsewhere don't need whole life. But whole life gives guaranteed 6-9%, forced savings, AND death benefit—unique combination. Plus tax relief on premiums.

Q: Can cash value exceed death benefit?

A: In very old age (90+), yes. At that point, policy becomes endowment (you receive cash value).

Q: What happens if insurer goes bankrupt?

A: Insurance Regulatory Authority protects policyholders. Choose AA-rated insurers for maximum security on multi-decade commitments.

Q: How do I claim the tax relief?

A: Claim when filing annual tax returns on iTax:

- Relief: 15% of premiums paid
- Maximum: Ksh 5,000/month (Ksh 60,000/year)
- Keep premium payment receipts and policy documents
- Can be claimed for policies on self, spouse, or child
